Who is my neighbor? There is poverty, homelessness, and need, right here in our neighborhood and in our parish. For so many families, if there is an unexpected event like an accident, loss of a job, or an illness, it becomes difficult to make ends meet. For many formerly stable families, the risk of actually losing their home is very real and frightening.

The Barnstable County Department of Human Services Point in Time Count of Cape and Islands Homeless took place on February 22, 2022, on Cape Cod, Martha's Vineyard, and Nantucket. On the Cape and Islands, the total number of homeless persons (adults and children, sheltered and unsheltered) counted on the night of February 22nd was 397, an increase of 54 from last year, and the highest number of homeless persons counted in the past eight years. This count does not include persons or families who are doubled-up and/or living with family and friends.

From Buzzards Bay to Provincetown, Cape Cod Vincentians are hard at work, every day, to feed, clothe, and shelter our less fortunate neighbors.
